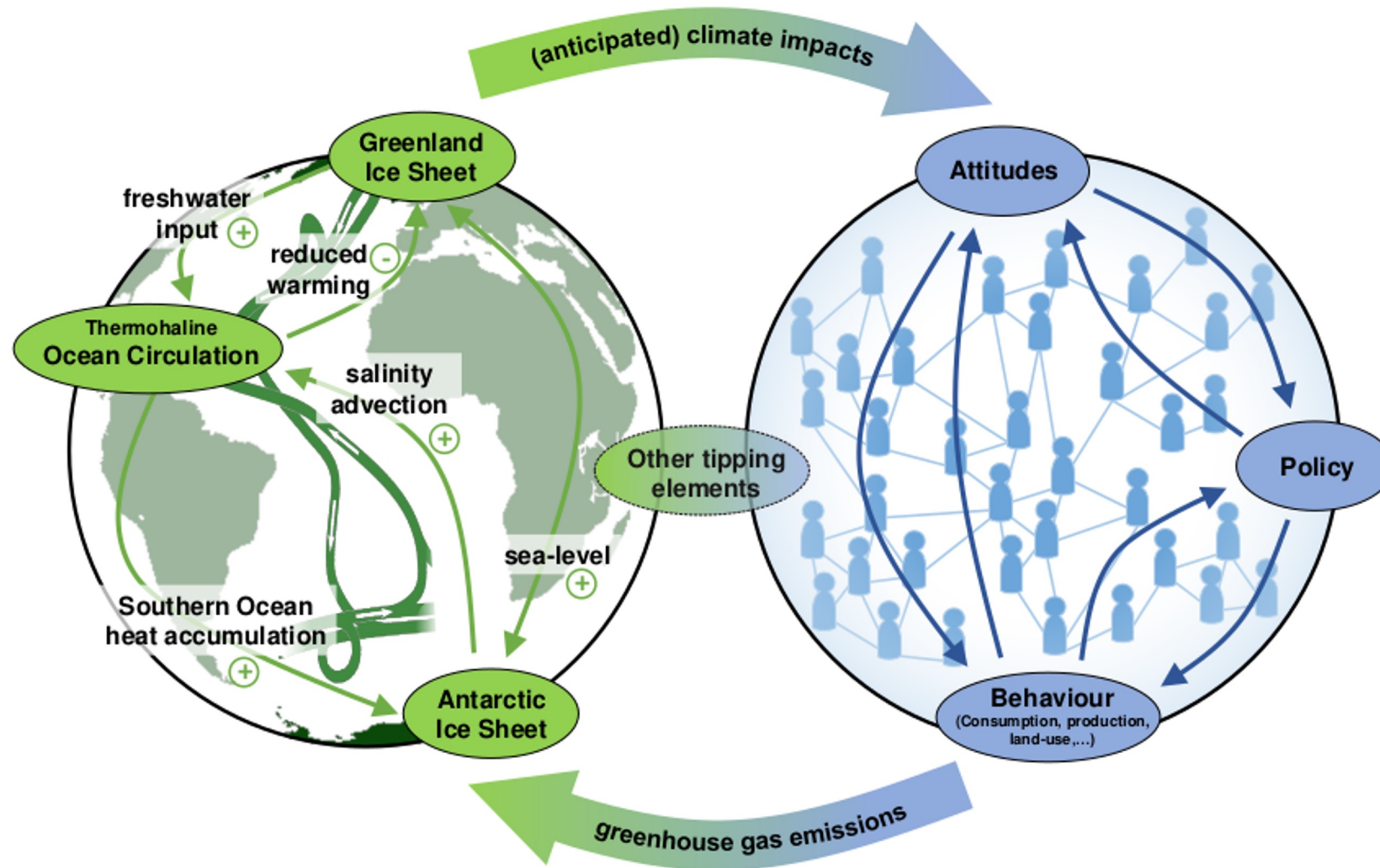
# Social Tipping - Definition

- [Small] changes within a social system (or in it's environment)
- Triggers rapid transformation to qualitatively different state
- Driven by 'runaway', mathematically positive, internal feedback

Open questions:

- Size of the change?
- Irreversibility?
- Normatively positive/negative?
- How to detect/predict/identify?

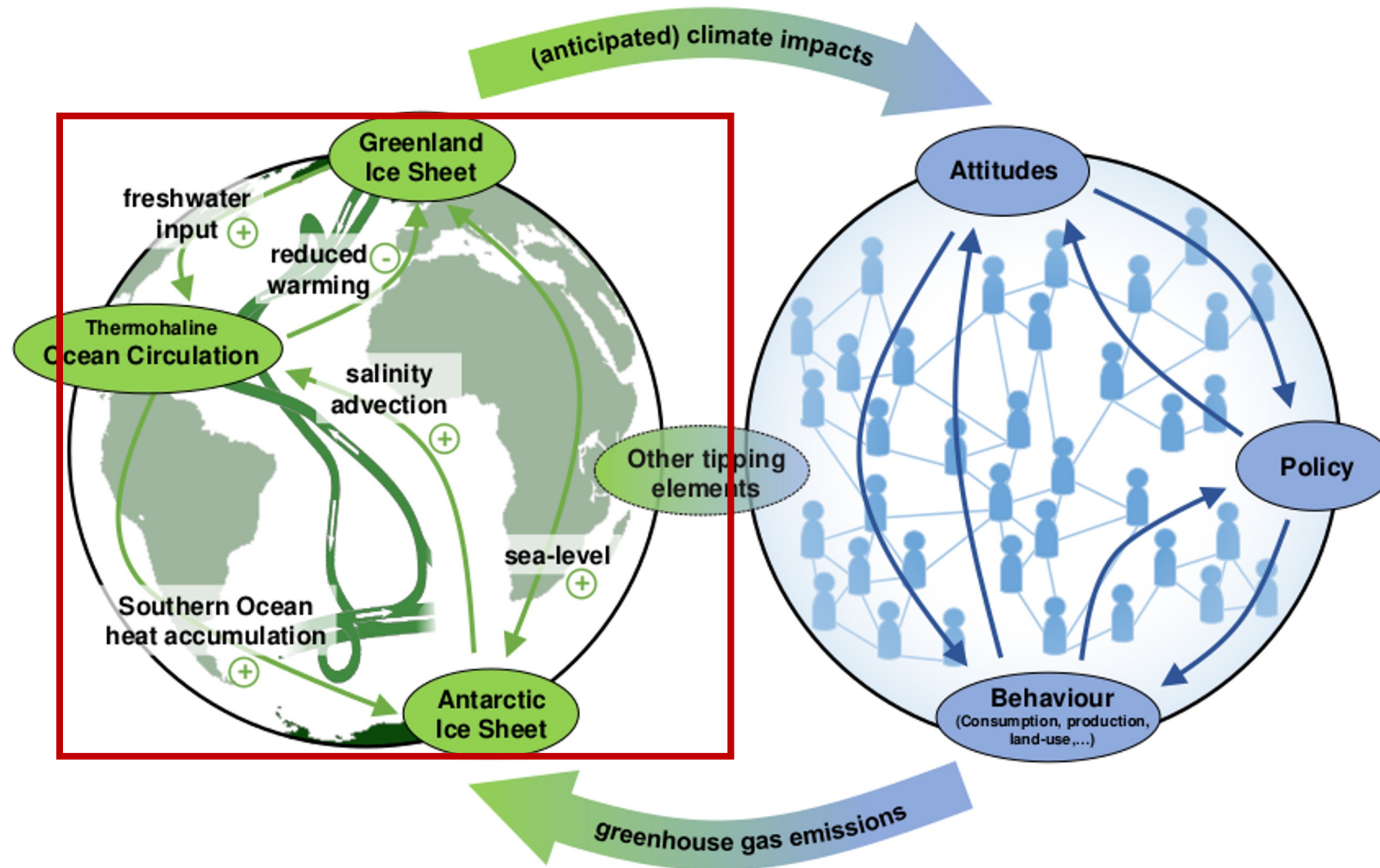

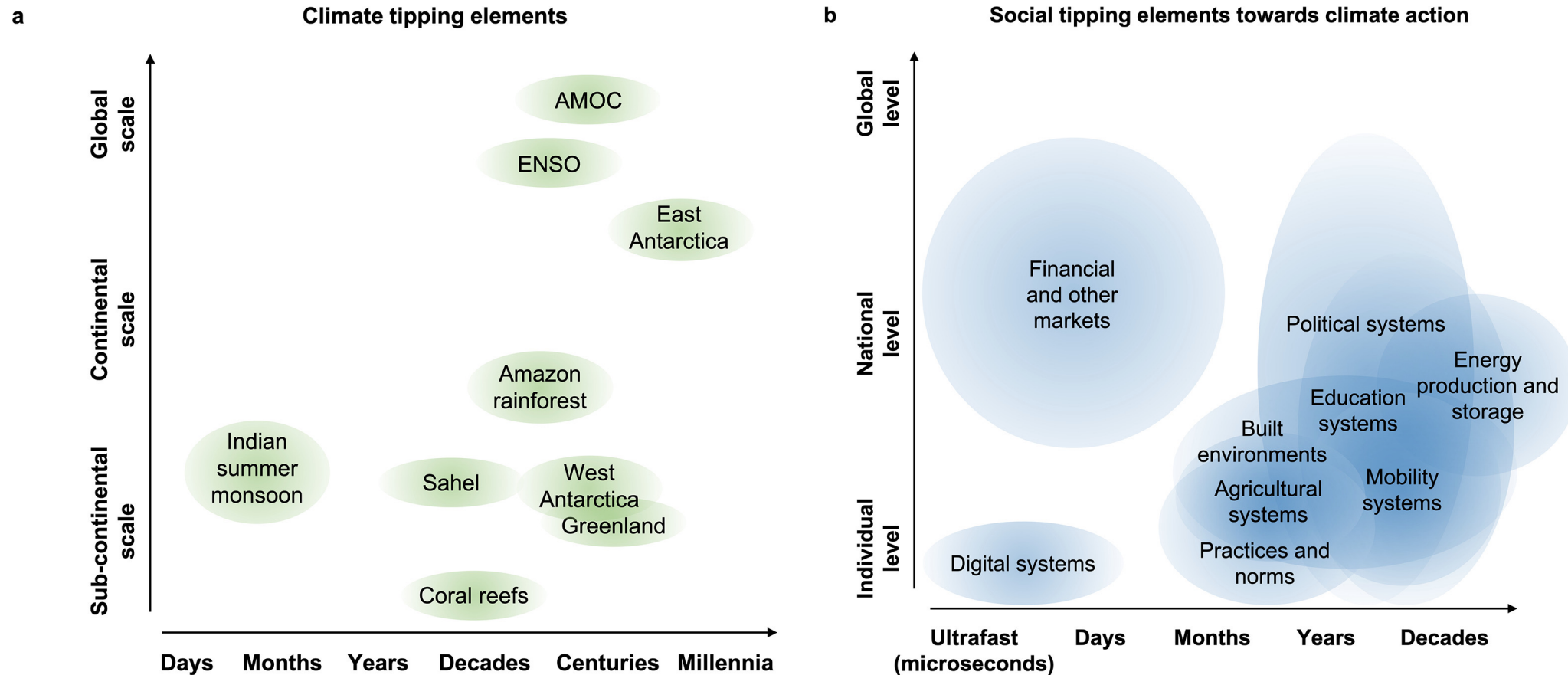


# Social Tipping – Measurement (survey data)

- Taxes:
  - (Baseline = 3) No new tax
  - 1) Increasing prices by 30%
  - 2) Increasing prices by 15%
- Earmarking:
  - (Baseline = 2) General government budget).
  - 1) Public environmental and climate protection programs
  - 3) public programs for low-income households
  - 4) Reduce income taxes
  - 5) No tax revenues
- Regulation:
  - (Baseline = 4) No such rules
  - 1) At least 75% vegetarian meals
  - 2) At least 50% vegetarian meals
  - 3) At least 25% vegetarian meals
- Discounts:
  - (Baseline = 3) No discounts)
  - 1) Reducing prices by 30%
  - 2) Reducing prices by 15%
- Standards:
  - (Baseline = 3) Standards kept at current level)
  - 1) Organic practices (no antibiotics/chemicals) & no cages
  - 2) Stringent limits on antibiotics/chemicals & large cages
- Campaigns:
  - (Baseline = 3) No campaigns)
  - 1) Frequent campaigns
  - 2) Occasional campaigns
- Subsidies:
  - (Baseline = 3) Keeping subsidies at current level)
  - 1) Eliminating subsidies
  - 2) Halving subsidies
- Framing:
  - (Baseline = Control)
  - Animal Welfare
  - Global Climate
  - Local Environment
  - Personal Health

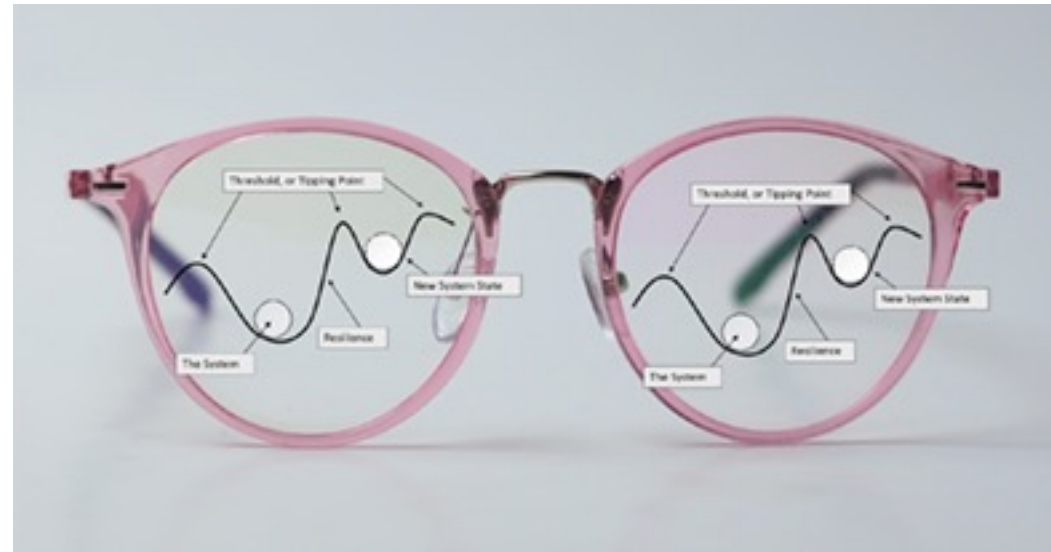

# Social Tipping – Complexity

- Non-deterministic associations
  - True cause and effect in social systems?
  - Generalizability?
- Irreversability?
- Can we ever identify ‘tipping point’ or triggering mechanism?

# Social Tipping – Criticism (Milkoreit 2023)

- Social tipping presumes systems can be manipulated and the intervention will have the desired effect
- Solutions are overly-deterministic (panacea)
- Not reflective of open-endedness of transformation development pathways
- Current literature is often abstract, often struggling to identify generalizable triggering mechanisms, specific critical thresholds and predictive tipping points

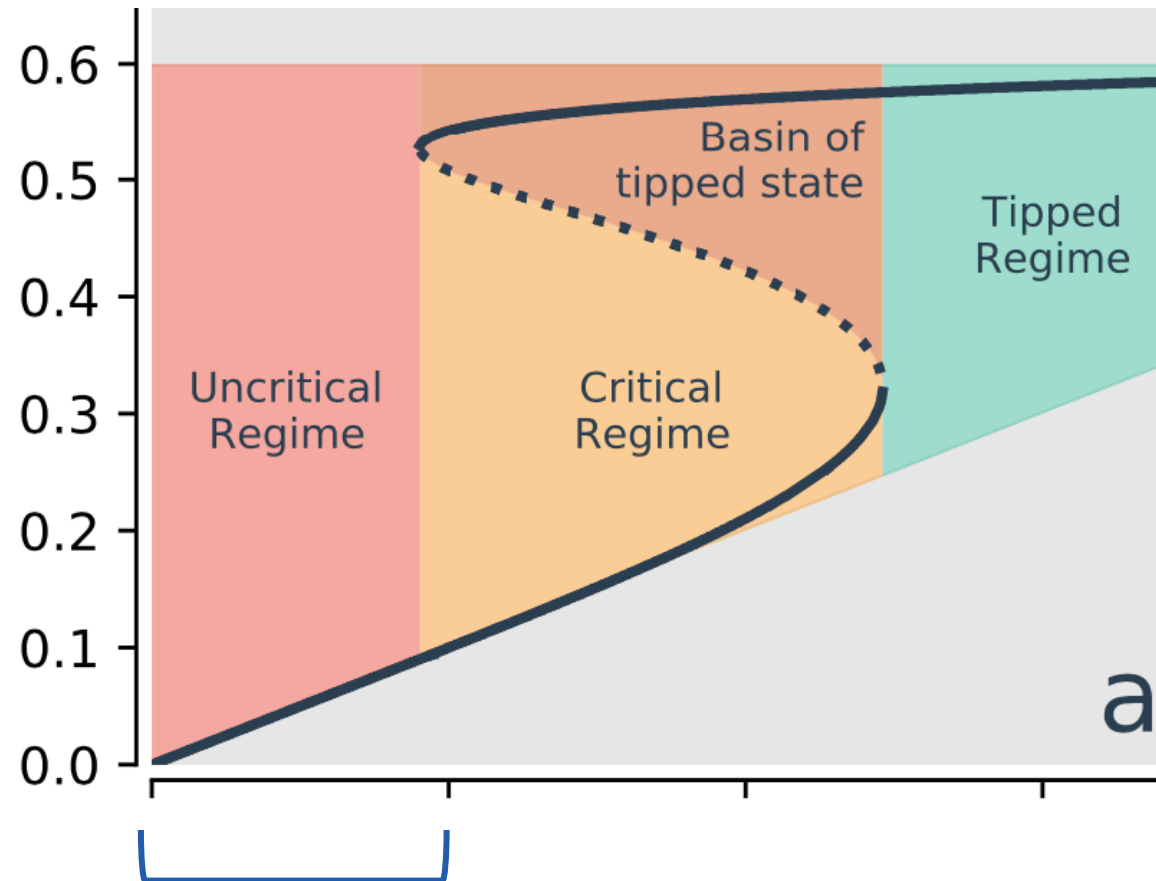

- Fostering high levels of criticality within a system is a **necessary condition** for societal tipping processes

# Criticality Perspective

- Criticality is **the susceptibility of a system to experience tipping processes**
- Fostering high levels of criticality within a system is a **necessary condition** for societal tipping processes
- Shift focus away from identifying unknown (or unknowable) specific triggers and towards fostering systemic conditions
  - tipping may develop from a multitude of intentional (or unintentional) triggers (e.g. interventions, events, or perturbations).

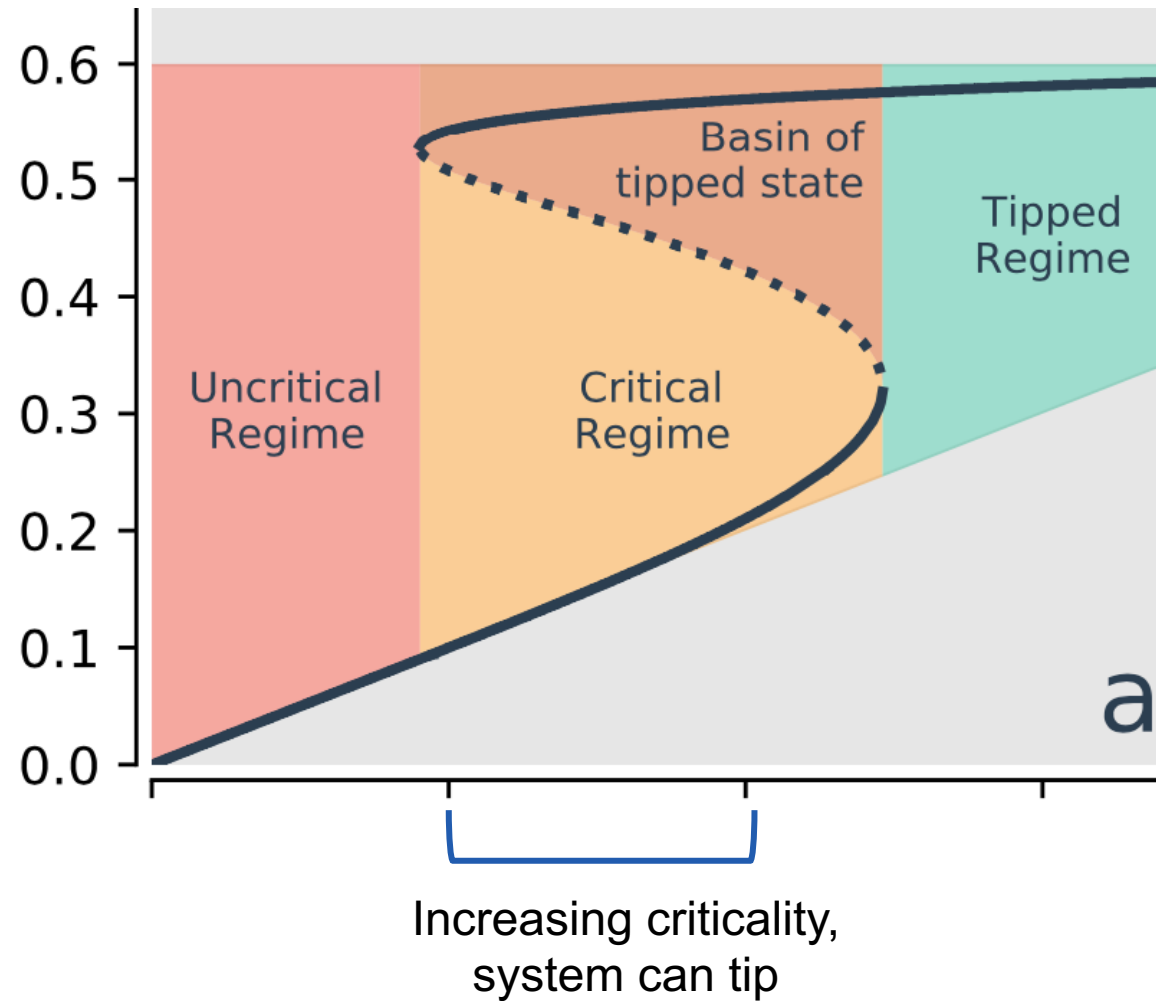

# Criticality Perspective

- Focusing on shaping systemic conditions towards, or away from, critical thresholds is actionable
  - Much of social science focuses on mechanisms which maintain or transform systems
- Does not rely upon panacea interventions. Highly critical states can be tipped by multitudes of unknown causes
  - Also facilitates interventions to reduce the likelihood of ‘negative’ tipping

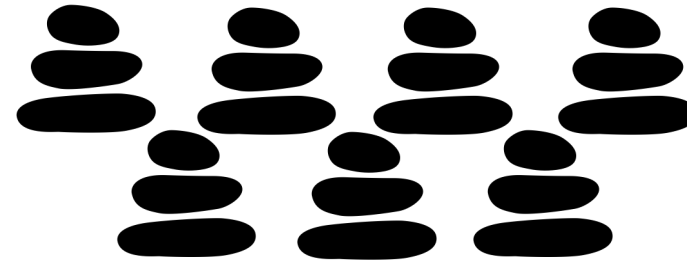

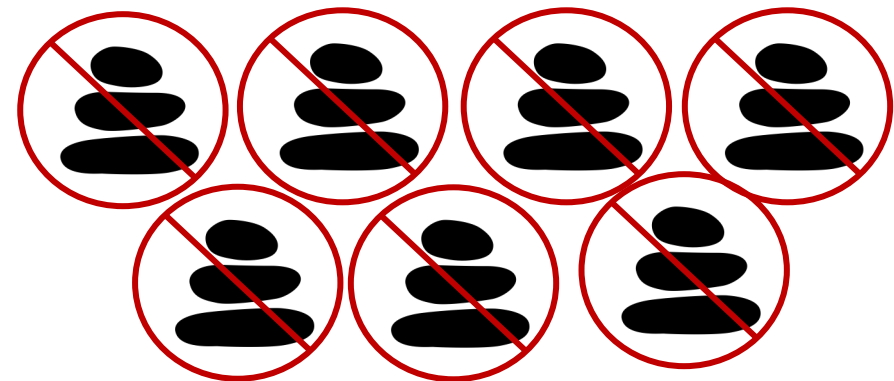

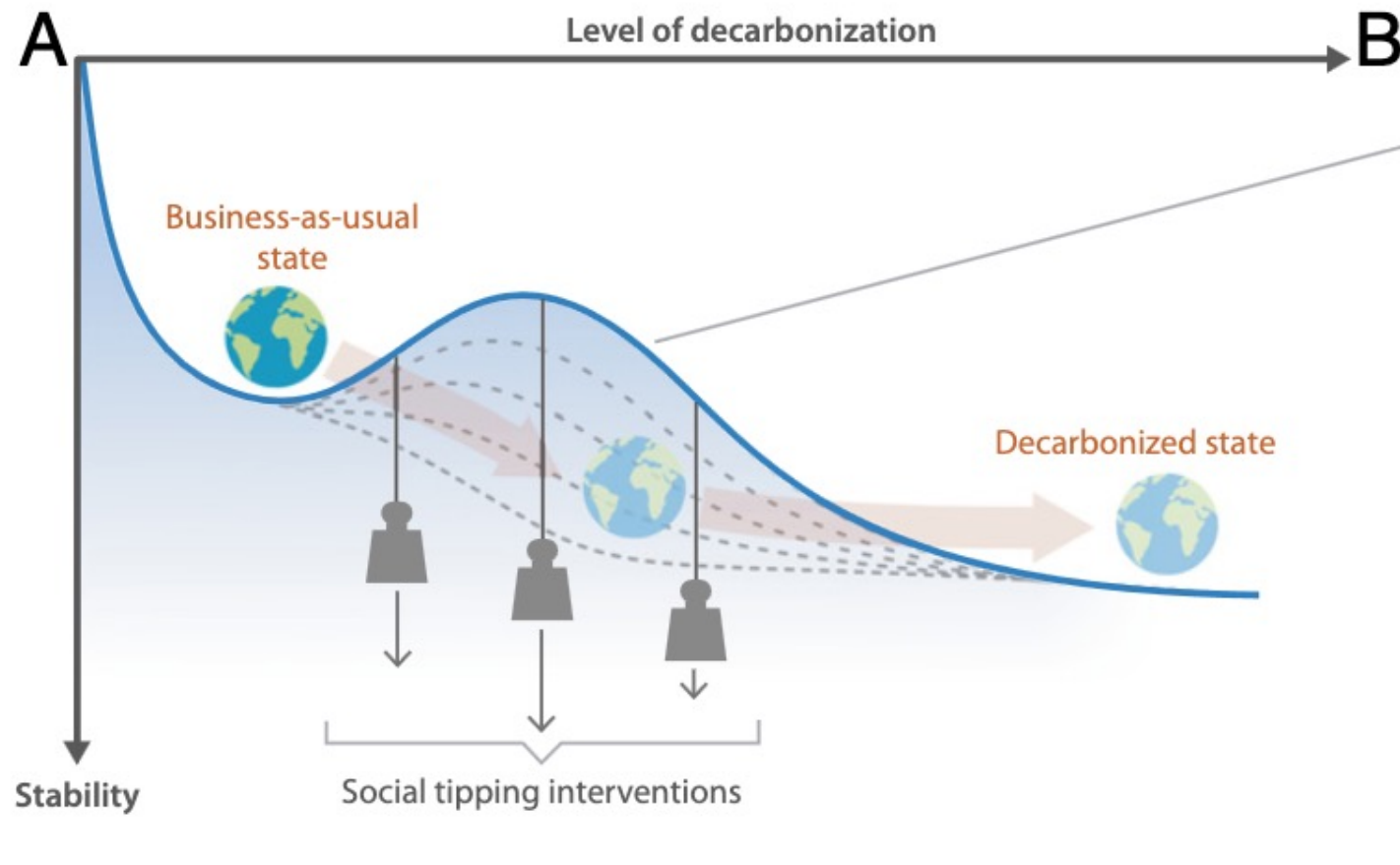

# Social systems as complex adaptive systems

- Societal tipping is more appropriately conceptualized as dynamics within complex adaptive and evolving systems
- Strong coupling to other systems (e.g. socio-cultural, political, institutional, and socio-technological)
- Resulting change is rather open-ended and non-deterministic
  - Better understood as path trajectories and bifurcation than “ball and cup” metaphor

# Critical agency – how to shape criticality

- Critical agency : Intentional manipulation of the criticality of a societal system, creating the enabling conditions fostering tipping processes
  - Agents within societal systems exhibit consciousness, knowledge, reflexivity, and foresight – the imagination and desire to intentionally transform the conditions of a system towards some desired goals
  - ‘Strategic’ form of agency, where actions taken by multiple actors in multiple locations at multiple levels over multiple time horizons change the system’s conditions through diverse transformation phase

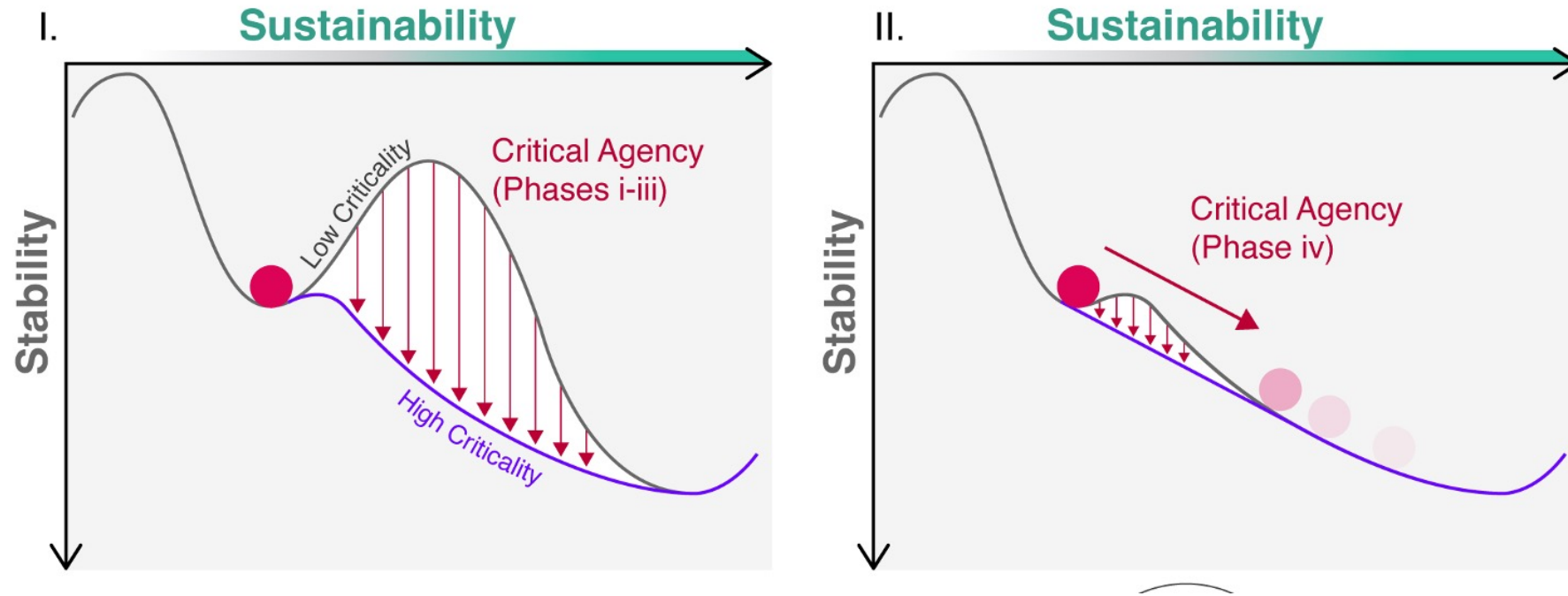

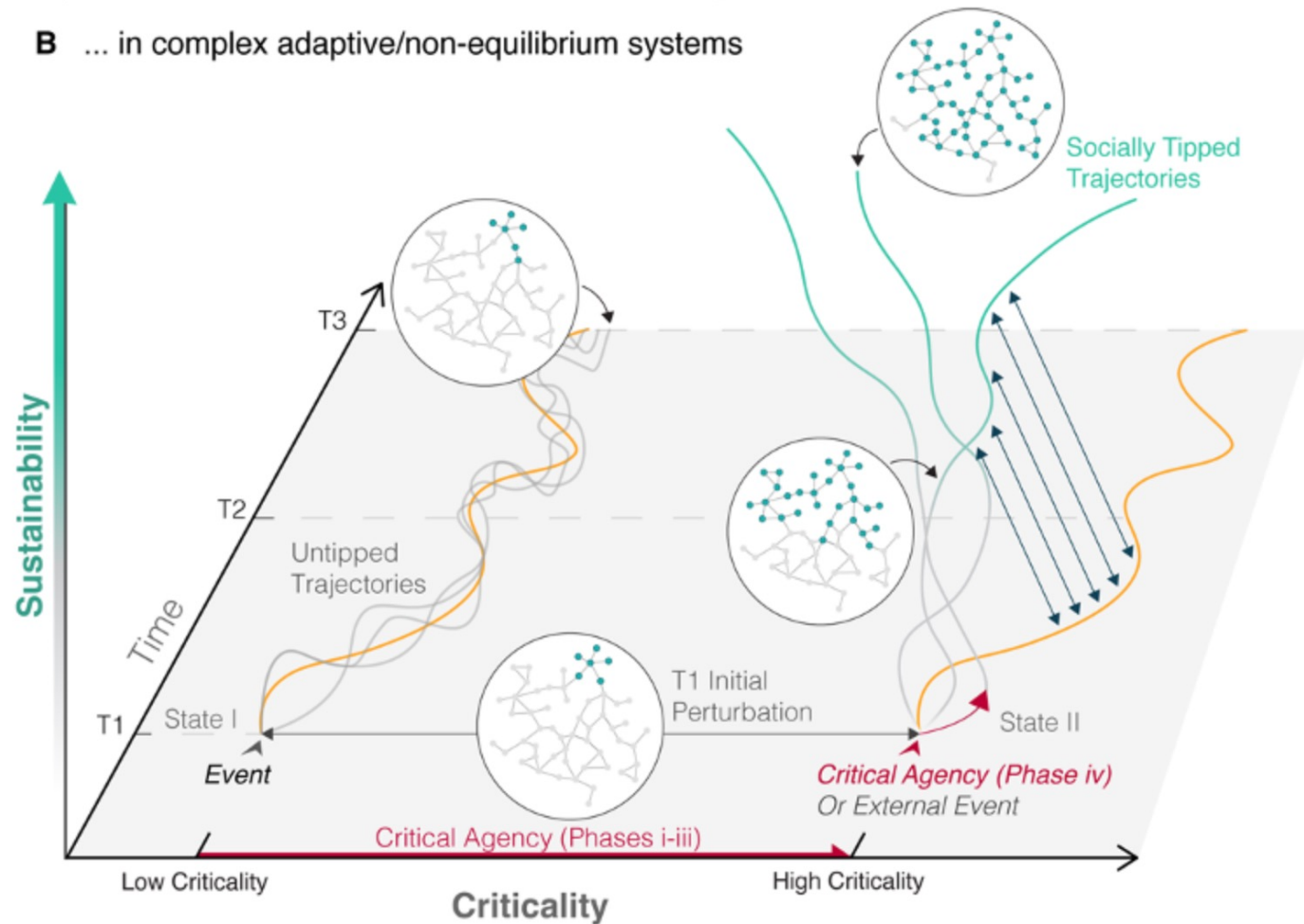

# Criticality Summary

- Social systems are complex adaptive systems. Approaches to tipping should identify and address issues related to complexity
  - The actual tipping point (trigger) is likely unknown, or unknowable
  - Tipping can be ‘positive’ or ‘negative’
  - The outcome of any intervention may not be controllable (multiple potential path trajectories)

# Criticality Summary

- Crucial preliminary step of intentionally re-shaping the system conditions is often overlooked in favour of developing specific interventions aimed at triggering tipping.
- Re-focus on societal tipping processes towards identifying the *criticality* of societal systems, and how strategic actions (*critical agency*) can influencing the likelihood that the system will tip.
- Systems with high criticality are more likely to tip. Tipping may develop from a multitude of intentional (or unintentional) triggers (e.g. interventions, events, or perturbations).

# Criticality Summary

- We can shape these conditions using we strategic actions, critical agency. We develop five actionable phases of critical agency that can be adopted to:
  - increase the criticality of a system
  - foster and trigger systemic tipping processes
  - and stabilise the ‘societally tipped’ path trajectory
- Goal is to bring social tipping back into the social sciences, to build upon theories of change and transformation to identify how to manipulate systemic conditions towards more ‘desirable’ path trajectories

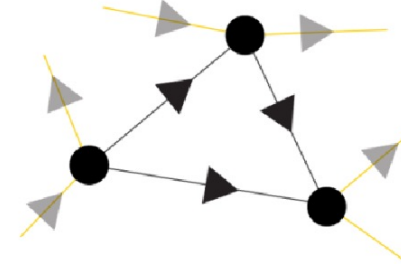
